You need to obtain a Fire Protection Occupational licence if you intend to carry out fire protection work for a licensed fire protection contractor either as an employee or subcontractor.

Qualifications?

Current qualifications:

- 1. Certificate III in Carpentry CPC30220; or
- 2. Certificate III in Wall and Ceiling Lining CPC31220

Specific Passive Fire Units:

- 1. Install dry wall passive fire-rated systems CPCCWC3003;
- Identify, inspect and test fire and smoke doors CPPFES2035;
- Identify, inspect and test passive fire and smoke containment products and systems CPPFES2039;
